### Literacy

**Day 16: Handwriting:** Today I would like you to practise your handwriting skills. As we are now gearing up to going back into school I would like to you spend some time focusing on your writing and your letter formation. Remember to think about the size and shape of each of your letters: Ascenders go right to the top, descenders go below the line, and the bodies of each letter go up to half way.

You can complete your own piece of writing or you can pick a section of writing from your favourite story book or a magazine and copy it out in your most beautiful handwriting.



**Day 17: Lockdown Memories:** For your literacy work today I would like to you record some of your experiences of lockdown. This can take any form you would like, for example it could be a recount, a diary entry, a letter to a friend or a poster.

We have been practising a range of skills for our literacy learning over the past few weeks. I would like you to have a go at using these in your writing today and I will be looking to see if you have used them.

I think it is good to reflect on the journey you have been on over the past few weeks. This lockdown has been very different to the lockdown we experienced last year and our learning has looked different too. We have had to learn so much! What have you enjoyed the most? What do you want to remember about this time in years to come? What are you excited to tell your friends about? Have a think about what you would like to share, record your ideas in a bubble map and then have a go at writing about your experience.
