

### **School Council are collecting crisp packets!**

You may have heard the news already?

In conjunction with the Manx Hedgehog Conservation Society our SPLM School Council has decided to collect used crisp packets and support the Walkers recycling project. We have already done very well but are happy to do better!



#### Here is the information we got from Sandy at MHCS

We have been in discussion with "Walkers Crisps" and have registered our charity as the only participants on the Island to be involved in this amazing recycling scheme. This is how it will work

We are inviting schools, companies, supermarkets and private parties to collect your empty crisp packets and when we have collections of over 400 a company named Terracycle who have partnered with Walkers will recycle the non-biodegradable or non-compostable packets into ..... garden furniture, roofing material and other items! These packets are made up of plastic and aluminium and take up to 33yrs to disintegrate.

The scheme was launched in December 2018 with 4,785 locations participating with drop off areas throughout the UK and Ireland but so far not the Isle of Man.

For every 2kg of empty crisp packets returned our conservation charity will be rewarded with £2 not a lot but our Manx countryside will be gradually rid of this everlasting material that causes unnecessary death to the Islands wildlife. Our Island is proud to be awarded the UNESCO biosphere status and to involve our children as custodians of our planet we feel passionately about the future.

Over 7 million walkers crisp packets are produced daily with over 60 million being bought weekly and they have promised to change the packaging into biodegradable and compostable by hopefully 2025. That is great news but we still have the problem in the meantime and you never know this might all change sooner if we highlight the problem NOW

Our School Council and pupils are passionate about making a difference and want to extend collections, with the support of Port St Mary Commissioners' Office, into the wider community. For now, please send any crisp packets to school, but ...
